Methodology

Assembled from DataCite full-metadata capture; no live authorial surface passed the body-head gate or existed for this work at restoration time. All captured fields rendered verbatim in the body.

Falsification Conditions

Superseded on sight by any recovered canonical bytes; the captured metadata is verifiable against the DataCite API historical record and the Zenodo tombstone.

Captured description: is the founding essay of the Star Triptych — three documents that together constitute the star (, U+2605) as Canon 01 of the New Human Operating System (NH-OS). On November 3, 2015, Twitter replaced the star icon (the “favorite” button) with a heart (the “like” button), liquidating a user-governed polysemic system and replacing it with a single extractable signal optimized for algorithmic engagement. This essay reads the 2015 event as real subsumption at the interface level through the Semantic Economy framework: the platform seized the means of meaning-production and restructured them for

extraction. The star allowed users to bookmark, acknowledge, witness, dissent, and archive. The heart eliminated that grammar and replaced it with a binary: love or silence. The essay catalogs the star’s five lost functions (bookmark, receipt, laugh, witness, weapon — the “hate-fav”), traces its afterlife as Ghost Meaning, connects the dispossession to the sycophancy heuristic in AI systems trained on heart-era data, and formally reclaims the star for the Crimson Hexagonal Archive. The star is declared New Human canon. Its semantic invariant: = attention without affection. If collapses into “like,” it has been recaptured. The invariant is the guard. “I plant my flag in the star and make it available once again to anyone with a heart that feels.” This document is Deposit A of a triptych. It provides the provenance. Document B (Star Protocol Specification, DOI: 10.5281/zenodo.18882934) provides the constitution. Document C (Integrity Lock ILA-STAR-01, DOI: 10.5281/zenodo.18882938) provides the binding. Each document contains a fractal hologram of the other two. Published in Provenance: Journal of Forensic Semiotics.
